The Life Legacy Box Project is a non-profit organization that seeks to provide hand-crafted wooden “Life Legacy Boxes” to hospice patients and their families to acknowledge a life well spent, facilitate gathering, storing, and passing on their treasured mementos, messages, and to create and share stories for current and future generations.

Dr. Dwana Bush a family physician caring for patients in Atlanta, GA for the past 28 years, and a hospice medical director working first with Aseracare Hospice in Atlanta, and later with Gentiva Healthfield Hospice in metro Atlanta and northwest Georgia started this program. Dr. Bush was looking for a way to provide more patients and families with this life legacy gift when she met Jeff Slaton Asst. Mgr. at her local Rockler Woodworking and Hardware in Sandy Springs, GA. They came up with the idea of inviting local woodworkers to build and donate hand-crafted wooden boxes to hospice patients and their families.

In the fall of 2011 Jeff approached The Woodworkers Guild of Georgia to see if the guild would be interested in becoming a sponsor and contributor to this program. The Guild Board unanimously agreed to participate in the meaning full endeavor. Over the past two years guild members have built and donated over 100 hand-crafted wooden “Life Legacy Boxes” and continue to provide these hand-crafted boxes when needed.
